PRESIDENT'S REPORT

What an interesting season we have had. It started out with so much promise and then abruptly ended, which was very anticlimactic! I would like to start by thanking the Board. It has been a challenging period for the Board with some difficult discussion and decisions having to be made. Their support during this time has been appreciated and I look forward to continuing to work with those that are staying and welcoming new members to the Board.

I would also like to thank all of our sponsors who continue to support us and our newest sponsor, Rockingham Toyota, for the fantastic vehicle you have provided the Club to help keep our beach safe. I receive nothing but positive comments regarding the vehicle. Without our sponsors support the Club would be unable to provide the assistance to various internal areas of the Club. I think everyone would agree that the support we get from Channel 9, Woodside, Alcoa, Charter Hall etc to name a few, is fantastic and very much appreciated.

We continue to work with the City of Rockingham regarding the possibility of gaining access to some of the external areas of the club to install signage to further highlight to the general public who our generous sponsors are.

One of the great additions to beach safety this season is the Patrol Tower. What a great tool to assist and improve the ability of our Patrols to observe the water. This is a fantastic and very comfortable facility. The support from the City of Rockingham, LotteryWest, SLSWA and Paul Papalia to get this tower on our beach was awesome and very much appreciated. I feel we have not been able to appreciate the full benefit this tower can provide Patrols yet. To assist with this we are looking at moving the tower to the North end of the beach access track, which will place it in an area that is often the safest part of the beach for swimmers. The tower also affords us the opportunity to explore

using it as a base location for patrols, which may free up resources and assist the Patrol to be very agile, which is not a bad thing when we are dealing with such a dynamic environment.

The café space continues to be a challenge to lease. Nalu has been the closest the Club has ever gotten to get a Business into the café. Having Nalu work out of the Club Kitchen worked well and it was great to observe what is required for a business to work out of this area and be profitable. However it has also been of great benefit to be able to discuss and understand the issues and risks a café faces should they take on the café space. Unfortunately, the risks were too great for Nalu and due to changes with personnel at their Mataya business, they were unable to continue with operating out of the Club Kitchen until the end of the season.

I believe that the Club now has had enough history regarding trying to lease out the café space that we are very close to having to completely rethink what we want to do with it. I understand that there is a desire by some Club members, the City of Rockingham and the general public that we have café in the "cafe space", however the possibility of this dream materialising has been very different to the reality. The Board are going to have to work on strategies, in consultation with the membership, regarding alternative options to the current business model for this space and then take this to the City of Rockingham.

Once again our core Business of keeping the public safe has been very successful. It is awesome that we have such a great team of dedicated trainers under Mark Dove and patrol members to be able to fulfil our obligations and face challenges presented to us. Once again our patrols acted professionally and highly competently when called upon to assist people in need. Some of these times were in trying conditions. It always makes me proud to be on the beach and see our Patrols in action. The Clubs support, with assistance from Port Bouvard and Mandurah SLSC's for abalone Patrols was also impressive. I had the privilege of being on the water at both Point Peron and Garden Island for abalone patrols and it was inspiring seeing the resources on the water and our dedicated volunteers on the land. The Club also supported abalone patrols North of the river and several Search and Rescue Operations along WA's coastline. Thank you and well done to everyone who was a Patrol Captain, donned a patrol cap, orange water safety cap or yellow rashie this season, you did yourselves and the Club proud.

Our Woodside Nippers was a success again and I would like to thank Bec Hughes and all of the age group managers, water safety coordinators and Nipper Rescue Certificate holders for the great work you have done. With Woodside coming on board as a State sponsor of Nippers, this also brought some changes to how Nippers has been run previously which produced some teething issues to start with.



We were looking like being very well represented at the Nipper State Championships and it was disappointing that this event did not go ahead, I think our result would have been impressive.

Our other competitors were also in the process of tapering for the States and were looking like they were going to achieve some great results. I would like to thank Sam and all of the coaches for your time and commitment this season. With the Aussies only 1 more season away before being back in the West, next season will be a great build one for the Club so that we can go hard for the 2022 Aussies. Surf sports remains a huge growth potential area for the Club and one that we need to explore more.

The Club finances are still in very good shape, however COVID-19 has affected our revenue in a negative manner with the loss of income from Fine Tune Fitness, the cancellation of several functions that had booked in and Friday and Sunday bar takings ceasing. We are also looking into the Government assistance that is available to businesses like ours.

Unfortunately, we did commit to expenses such as replacing the ATV, finishing off the boat shed etc. prior to COVID-19 so these commitments were required to be fulfilled which reduced our cash reserves.

Areas that remain a focus for improvement includes the Board structure. The Board have developed a framework and we now need a committee to put the meat on the bones of this framework. We will put forward to vote on this new structure at the AGM. Another area for improvement is communications. We still are not providing a consistent platform to be able to communicate to all of our members, as such the board are looking at what is the best platform that will allow us to communicate to all members. We have also found that there is not a great deal of control of communication mediums that bare the SHSLSC name. So these will need to be tidied up so that our members and the public are confident that communication that bears the SHSLSC name is official Club comms. Our culture remains an area for improvement. We still don't have a

distinct SHSLSC culture. The Board will continue to put the framework in place that helps define our culture and the positive and negative behaviours that are and are not acceptable.

Finally, there are many people like Mark Thomas, Jeff Poad, Ron and Kim Wade, Lisa Sertorini and her BBQ ladies, Sam Lowe, Garry and Megan Williams, Iain Noorman and others who are unsung heroes and have helped out but I have not named. Thank you to all of you. Without your support, the Club would not function as well as it does. I would also like to thank Trish and Jacqui. Your support to the Board and assistance with helping make the Club administration run smoothly is greatly appreciated. I am hopeful that by the time this report is available to the membership that some of the COVID-19 restrictions are beginning to lift and we can at least begin training activities again and that next season will be looking like going back to normal.

A thirst for knowledge and a love for the surf is what helps build the enthusiasm amongst our younger members to one day don the red and yellow uniform and patrol our beautiful Aussie coastline. Our presence at carnivals across all levels of competition did not go unnoticed, especially at the Smiths Beach Country Carnival where each and every competitor, parent, age manager, spectator and volunteer wore their club colours proudly. I would like to personally thank our trainers, assessors, coaches, age managers, parents, patrol captains and committee members for willingly dedicating your precious time throughout the summer and winter months; your efforts are what keep our community going.

We held two surf carnivals at our beach in December. We received nothing but the highest of praise as a club for the organisation, participation and hard work that went into both of those fantastic weekends. Our members set up the beach arenas, the water arenas, first aid areas, clubhouse, sausage sizzle, live music on the sundeck and four wheel drives to help transport the significant amount of gear and equipment from one place to the next.

They also volunteered to Officiate and fill both water safety and first aid requirements. Another service we conduct as a club are Abalone Patrols. These occur on the second Saturday of the three summer months each year, taking place at Penguin Island and Point Peron. We cover these locations both on foot and by Jetski. Two of these operations this season included the opportunity for some rock rescue training with the Rescue Water Craft in vicinity of Penguin Island's offshore reef.

The volunteers who helped clean and reorganise the boat shed this season did a wonderful job and after speaking to quite a few people, I know that the good work done by members of our community has not gone unnoticed. The same goes for those that volunteer on Sundays to do the BBQs, bar shifts and water safety; you guys help keep us a well oiled machine.

To the members who achieved awards this year, congratulations! Receiving an SLSWA award is always something to be celebrated. In achieving these, recipients demonstrate dedication to their community development as well as their own. Our season saw a substantial number of people completing their Bronze, SRC and NRC Certificates, First Aid awards, IRB Crew and Drivers' Certificates, and a few RWC Operators and Trainers received their qualifications too.

Unfortunately, the COVID-19 pandemic caused us to cut short what was shaping

up to be one of our best seasons yet. Even though the season wrapped up earlier than planned and activities were shut down, we as a Board are so thankful and proud of the incredible commitment of our members for continuing patrols and conducting them in a very professional manner. Jetski Operators from Secret Harbour SLSC also conducted roving patrols at beaches along the metropolitan coastline over the Easter long weekend to assist the Lifeguard services in handling the sheer volume of beach users that were in attendance. The Lifeguards that I have spoken to have complimented us on our impeccable skills and utmost professionalism in our operations. Once the global outbreak takes a positive turn and restrictions in both WA and the whole country are lifted, I look forward to seeing you all again in the summer. 

This year has been another successful year on the beach for the lifesaving patrols. This season has seen 49,643 people recorded visiting Secret Harbour beach on the days we patrolled. We performed 147 rescues and conducted 91 first aids, with 1057 preventative actions recorded.

Our core patrol remained at Secret Harbour beach, with roving patrols undertaken up to the dog beach and down to Golden Bay and Singleton.

We started our patrols a little later this year, in mid-October and had intended to patrol weekends and public holidays through to the Easter long weekend, unfortunately due to the COVID-19 pandemic, our patrolling season was cut short by a couple of weeks. As the season was cut short, some members were not able to complete their last make up or substitute patrol so in the assessment of patrol compliance for the season allowance has been made members

for members to be down one patrol for season to still be considered patrol compliant for the purposes of long service, patrolling members discounts and gym membership.

This season we tried a new method of rostering patrols. Instead of members nominating for one patrol team, they were asked to submit preferences for three teams. Members were then allocated to one of their preferences looking holistically at the requirements to fill the patrol roster, with most being able to be placed in their first preference. While not perfect, this resulted in a better balance of numbers and skills between the patrol teams.

Some patrol teams still proved hard to fill, especially those with patrols on long weekends or key carnival days.

Sixteen percent of our members indicating that they would patrol this season asked to be put on the supplementary list. The supplementary list is for those whose circumstances (generally their employment) preclude them from patrolling with a regular patrol team. While it is always great to see them patrolling down at the beach having a significant percentage of our members unable to commit to a regular rostered patrol makes it a challenge to put together the patrol roster to fulfil our patrolling

commitments. We need to continually look at how we put together our rosters to ensure that we provide maximum opportunities for members to patrol and that we are utilising them when they are on patrol.

On Sunday the 8th of March this year we celebrated International Women's Day and 40 years of women in Surf Lifesaving with an all female patrol team.

Particularly busy days for rescues this season were 27 Oct (Patrol 3), 10 Nov (Patrol 7), 15 Dec (Patrol 7) and Christmas Day, with Christmas Day having the vast majority of rescues recorded for the season.

This year the abalone season was again held over four hours on Saturday mornings. The club provided water safety coverage at Penguin Island and Point Peron during

the abalone season (with assistance from Mandurah, Port Bouvard). Thanks to Gary Williams for coordinating the Abalone patrols this season.

The club also provided water safety services to a number of community groups including: Rockingham Open Water Swim Rockingham Youth Beach Party

Overall patrol hours logged for the year were 3921 with an additional 551 hours logged for water safety. This is a great effort by the club, and is a significant volunteer contribution to the community.

The season would not be successful without the work of the lifesaving committee and the Patrol Captains and Vice Captains. These people have worked hard to make sure that patrols are filled, vehicles are fuelled, IRBs and jetskis

are maintained, radios work, and first aid gear is ready.

Principal Activities



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2020

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Committee have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the Secret Harbour Surf Life Saving Club Inc. is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the financial reporting requirements of the members.

The financial report covers Secret Harbour Surf Life Saving Club Inc. as an individual entity. Secret Harbour Surf Life Saving Club Inc. is an association incorporated in Western Australia under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB'), as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities under the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012 and the Associations Incorporations Act 2015.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Association in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs. The accounting policies set out below have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

Accounting Policies

(a) **Income Tax**

The Association has obtained tax-exempt status under current Australian Taxation legislation.

(b) **Inventories**

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined by the purchase price of the inventories.

(c) **Property, Plant and Equipment**

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses (if any).

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

(c) **Property, Plant and Equipment (CONT'D)**

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of motor vehicles and other assets is depreciated on a reducing balance basis.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
First aid room equipment	10% to 20%
Merchandise and Office equipment	10% to 100%

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are included in the income statement.

(d) **Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand and cash at banks.

(e) **Revenue**

Revenue from donations and Interest revenue are recognised upon receipt of the funds.

Grants received for recurrent expenditures and member's subscriptions are recorded as income in the year in which they are earned.

Revenue from sale of goods (trading income) is recognised when the control of goods is passed to members/customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).




