PRESIDENT'S REPORT

What a year! Before I begin my report, let me thank my predecessor Ian Noorman for his time in the president role at the start of this season and for his efforts getting the Club focused on the vacant downstairs area. Due to Ian's passion and drive we have progressed the space's future and look forward to announcing the results in the not-too-distant future.

I would like to thank SLSA and SLSWA for their continued funding and support provided over the season. Their contributions through the National Beach Safe Equipment Fund, COVID-19

financial support, and abalone patrols have been instrumental in aiding our Club to deliver essential surf lifesaving services. Thank you also to our long-standing supporter of the Club, the Honourable Paul Papalia CSC MLA, for providing over \$100,000 in state government funding to the Club for infrastructure improvements such as the patrol shelter upgrade and aircon for the top floor servery. Minister Papalia's additional support of the ninth year of the Crusaders program ensured our youth were well-trained and engaged for the patrol season. To our other sponsors a huge thank you for your support this



season - the Club could not continue to provide the equipment for our lifesaving, surf sports and nippers programs without your ongoing support.

Our patrolling members showed great commitment on our beach this season with a season total of 5,422 hours volunteered in beach patrols, abalone patrol and water safety event support. With everyone's efforts on the beach we provided a safe and secure environment to the local community with 31 rescues and 869 preventative measures recorded during the season. I am also proud to acknowledge the many positive

comments of the professionalism of our members, and thanks for the service we provide. Well done to all who patrolled and thanks for your contribution to the Club this season.

Nippers and Starfish Nippers had another fantastic year with many new faces on the beach all enjoying themselves and developing their surf skills. It is great to see the beach abuzz with kids on Sunday mornings and seeing families enjoying the surf together. The age managers have done a fantastic job coordinating Nippers this season, but also to the water safety co-ordinator, power craft

and water safety volunteers; the BBQ chefs, parents and guardians helping with beach set-up and pack-up; and to the parents that were taking part in beach activities every Sunday, your efforts are greatly appreciated - Nippers would not be able to function without this support. The focus next season is to better communicate with Nipper parents, encouraging more ways for you to join in the activities and programs of the Club.

Our unique cadet training program, the Crusaders, continues to grow at the Club in its ninth year. It's very pleasing to see the tremendous commitment from our

younger members – they can always be seen around the Club involved in training or training others, supporting the Club on patrol, in providing water safety support or with Starfish Nippers; or generally helping around the Clubhouse. A highlight at the start of the season was learning that the program's leader, Garry Williams had been chosen as Australian Trainer of the Year. A big thanks to Garry Williams for his endless energy, vision and skills; and to his team of mentors and the Youth Committee for providing this great program.

Our competitors and coaches have had a great season with many successful

competition results across all disciplines and ages from Nippers to masters. This season has seen an increased interest in competition at the Club with a strong band of dedicated athletes, coaches and parents attending training and competitions throughout the season. I would like to thank all the coaches and athletes for their dedication, commitment; and state and Australia-wide travel that has certainly put Secret Harbour SLSC's name out in the wider surf community.

All members would agree another great group of people who

give up a significant amount of time year after year are our trainers, assessors and officials. These functions are critical for any surf Club to continue delivering on its promise, so we are extremely lucky to have some of the very best trainers in Australia at Secret Harbour SLSC. The trainers and assessors continue to keep our members proficient and highly trained while the officials enable our competitors to compete at carnivals. Thanks to each one of you for your continued efforts.

I would also like to thank the Board of Management, office bearers and

the office and bar staff this year for all their work during the season, the Club could simply not function without your dedication to our Club culture. This year was our Club's 40th anniversary of association with SLSWA, and you all worked with passion to ensure our Club is poised for another fantastic forty years.

— LIFE SAVING REPORT

The season turned out to be much better than 2020/2021 for a number of reasons: the previous season was tough dealing with COVID-19 restrictions and the knock-on effects from this pandemic and, whilst COVID-19 didn't go away, it was much less damaging than the year before. As

our lifesavers learned to adapt to the new environment, the ability to operate as close as possible to normal increased. As in the year before, the training team did a fantastic job overcoming many of the shortfalls in the training qualifications and we were well prepared for the start of the season.

This year was a season of renewal throughout the patrols with a focus on bringing in new leaders and incumbents into key positions. The two roles I focused on this season were Patrol Captains and IRB Drivers. Four new Patrol Captains stepped up with Lesley Santer, Nicola Awang, Neil Belton and Dave McCarron



being the new faces in these positions. Seven out of eight of the IRB Drivers were new in the roles having completed their course at the end of last season. Several of the Vice Patrol Captains were first time incumbents and supported the Patrol Captains well.

To provide support for the new members, a mentor was assigned to a patrol. Each mentor was assigned to the team to focus on consolidating the newly acquired skills in the IRB or being a guiding hand to the new Patrol Captains. The mentors brought skills and experience gained over many seasons and several of the mentees commented that it was comforting to know that if they were unsure of anything, there was help right next to them to call upon.

The number of lifesavers on patrol was up from last year with the patrol roster needing to be extended to include the additional members. The breakdown of the patrols showed many of the members are still young in years but gaining qualifications that would normally be expected of lifesavers several years their senior. What is pleasing is that these young members are doing the jobs well and fitting comfortably into these higher roles. This achievement is primarily a credit to the individuals but also the Crusaders and

youth programs within the Club and the structured training that occurs within these programs.

The diversity in patrols continues to generally reflect the society in which we live. Our youngest patrolling member is heading towards 14 and our oldest over eighty years. We have a good mix of females and males in all positions from Patrol Captain down to SRCs and several members who are not Australian born. We have a limited number of members from racially diverse backgrounds but acknowledge we have more work to be done in this area. The Patrol Shelter was refurbished over the winter period and was looking good for the start of the season. The cost of the refurbishment was considerable and was funded by the State Government through the local state member of parliament, Mr Paul Papalia, CSC MLA. The shelter was almost totally rebuilt from the tyres and axles up through strengthening of the chassis, re-skinning of the outsides and new paint inside and out. After new stickers all round it looked good for the start of the season.

SLSWA provided us with a new IRB and motor at the beginning of the season which allowed us to retire and sell the old and tired Achilles hull and two of our old

motors. Many other items of equipment were replaced such as rescue tubes and boards as well as miscellaneous items including loudspeakers, binoculars and first aid kits. These replacements made sure we were in a materially good state for the beginning of the season.

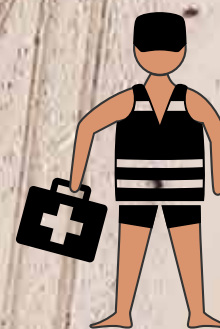
As well as patrols at Secret Harbour beach, we also completed four patrols for abalone fishing. This was one less than last year with all of them well attended and we met all our patrol requirements. As for many seasons gone by, these patrols are only made possible with considerable extra work in the background to organise watercraft and other equipment as well as the parents who get up early to get the young lifesavers to Mersey Point on time. These patrols bring in valuable funds into the Club that fund our lifesaving activities. They also extend the skills of our lifesavers as well as extend our brand to another group of beachgoers.

Water safety for events continued with several completed for local community organisations. These events bring in essential funding for the Club, but we had ongoing difficulties getting enough people with the right skills to fill the positions. The surf boat crews filled a significant number of these positions with other members assisting when they could. The main reason

for the difficulty in filling the positions appears to lie in the concurrent events that coincidentally happen on the same days. Some of these can't be helped as they are beyond the Club's control, but others may be able to be rescheduled in future years to avoid an overload on the Club's resources on some days. This is something the Board and key members will be addressing in planning for the 2022/2023 season.

The patrol and water safety hours this year increased markedly with a total of 5,422 hours completed over the season.

Of this number, the rostered hours completed for beach patrol was 2,948 which meant an average of 12 lifesavers were on each patrol across the season and this is the optimum number for our patrol requirements. With most patrols full and overfull, it's a nice problem to deal with!

The total number of rescues for the year was 31 which was down considerably from last year, likely due to the milder surf conditions and COVID-19 restrictions still suppressing

the number of people on the beach swimming and surfing this season. Driving the low rescue numbers is the high number of preventative activities (869) being carried out throughout the season. I recall while on a patrol I was watching a young Bronzie and SRC conducting a roving foot patrol, proactively talking to the public about a rip that was in front of them and the hazards their children may encounter if they swam in that area. It wasn't the first time I saw this occur - I suspect this ongoing active engagement is a considerable impact to rescue needs. A lot goes on in the background to make the patrols work smoothly, ranging from making sure the rosters work, through to keeping the equipment operating correctly and fully stocked. For the most part this work is not seen, and it just happens via a committee of quiet achievers. Thank you to Sam Lowe, Patrol Officer; Declan Tyrrel, IRB Officer; Garry Williams for taking care of the jet skis; Jo Thodis and Lorry Rule, First Aid Officers; and to Joe Ford, Drone Officer.

FINANCIAL REPORT

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Jane and Kim in the office for their help with maintaining the accounts of the club throughout the year.

Whilst the Club finances are still in very good shape we have made a small loss for the year. This was mainly due to:

- COVID-19 impacting our revenue in a negative manner with the loss of Hall Hire income and the cancellation of several booked functions. Whilst we did receive some financial support to help reduce the impact of COVID, it was nowhere near the level of support that we received last year.
- Some of the club's activities and initiatives during the season for example some of the Friday night and Sunday bar sessions did not provide the level of return to all members that we would have liked.

This year has been a learning journey for myself and the board of management and we now understand a lot more about the financial dynamics of the club. The club has a very bright financial future, and we

have many initiatives that will help us to improve our bottom line.

The work to be undertaken in the next year will see us reduce our costs to a sustainable level, while providing a higher quality service to members and the community. We will be shaping our ventures towards those that provide the best value to members.

In addition to our core Lifesaving responsibilities, we will be focusing on initiatives that raise revenues, for example, maintaining good relationships with sponsors and the business community, applying for grants, conducting fund raising events and providing water safety at sports events. Our ability to undertake these initiatives is dependent on the number of members who volunteer to help the club.

I would encourage everyone to support the club by volunteering in 2023. Volunteering is a great social activity that



helps people to meet and network with fellow clubbies and give back to the club.

All funds raised from our initiatives will go towards developing our people, in particular our youth, improving our facilities, and raising the profile of our club in the wider community. In essence the funds will help us to build a better club.

I look forward to working with the Board and members and returning the club to profit in 2023.





NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Committee have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the Secret Harbour Surf Life Saving Club Inc. is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the financial reporting requirements of the members.

The financial report covers Secret Harbour Surf Life Saving Club Inc. as an individual entity. Secret Harbour Surf Life Saving Club Inc. is an association incorporated in Western Australia under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB'), as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities under the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012 and the Associations Incorporations Act 2015.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Association in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs. The accounting policies set out below have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

Accounting Policies

- (a) **Income Tax**
The Association has obtained tax-exempt status under current Australian Taxation legislation.
- (b) **Inventories**
Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined by the purchase price of the inventories.
- (c) **Property, Plant and Equipment**
Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses (if any).

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

(c) **Property, Plant and Equipment (CONT'D)**

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of motor vehicles and other assets is depreciated on a reducing balance basis.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
First aid room equipment	10% to 20%
Merchandise and Office equipment	10% to 100%
Rescue, Training and Comp equipment	10% to 100%
Social hall, bar and canteen	10% to 100%
Building	10% to 100%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed and adjusted, if appropriate, at each balance date.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are included in the income statement.

- (d) **Cash and Cash Equivalents**
Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand and cash at banks.

- (e) **Revenue**
Revenue from donations and Interest revenue are recognised upon receipt of the funds.

Grants received for recurrent expenditures and member's subscriptions are recorded as income in the year in which they are earned.

Revenue from sale of goods (trading income) is recognised when the control of goods is passed to members/customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

This year started out strong with Director of House & Social, Rene Pollard hosting regular events on the sundeck and our first-floor function room. The Club trialled opening the bar Friday nights and Sunday afternoons as a way of building regular customers.

We welcomed great bands to the sundeck such as Krissy Smith and her trio, plus guitarists such as Tim Hibberd and Greg Carter, Sam McGovern and so many more. We celebrated world themes with national pizza, wine and chilli days, showcasing our magnificent view alongside delectable food and wine. We welcomed members from other Clubs to enjoy our view and hospitality after seniors and regional carnivals. Thanks to our bar staff, who on very busy days and nights handled the crowds with the utmost professionalism and to Kim and Jane in the office for support with bookings, ordering stock, arranging rooms and bar service.

We delivered a Nippers canteen from October to March, feeding more than 400 Nipper kids and their family's hearty food and snacks and allowing them to refuel before going on with their Sunday. Each carnival, we delivered catering to officials and breakfast and lunch menus to the hungry crowd of competitors and their families. Often we worked in the canteen with too small a group of volunteers to be able to serve so many Nippers kids as soon as they're off the beach. We made some mistakes, but learned that without enough volunteers,

the canteen is not sustainable and so we're reviewing different service options for the next season. To those parents and guardians that did help in the canteen, the Board thanks you for your time and community spirit. Some of you always heard the call for the carnival canteens. It's people like you that make the world go around.

The biggest thanks go to Lisa Sertorini and her army of carnival helpers, to the parents that always said yes at the Nippers registration briefing, and to Amy Hilbers for managing the Nipper canteen and bar on Sundays.

In February we learned we had been approved to hold our own fundraising license, opening up opportunities to us such as regular raffles and fundraising events, to help fill the coffers for surf Club equipment.

The Director House and Social also supported the Clubs growing function bookings, enabling our Clubhouse venue and hospitality services to continue to generate revenue for the Club on all days of the week.

It was a tremendous amount of volunteer time, office staff time and passion that delivered these functions, canteen and bar events and gave our Club the momentum we have now in social membership growth and for our

STARFISH NIPPERS

Once again we'd like to extend a big thank you to our sponsor Alcoa, for enabling us to run our fourth successful season of the Starfish Nipper program.

The program starts in late January of each season as an eight-week program, this runs on the beach alongside the Woodside Nippers on Sunday mornings. The Starfish participants have individual goals set for the season which is discussed with the parents of each child before the start of the program to ensure each Starfish Nipper is set up for success. This early preparation sets the course of learning and fitness outcomes for the season.

The fitness aspects of the program are based on running and swimming. This is interwoven with lifesaving skills to increase the challenge and interest of the participants. However, remaining flexible in the lesson outcomes are very important, as well as adaptation as the season progresses. The routines attempt to remain structured throughout the season to improve confidence and build trust in the supervisors and assistants.

The skills that have been focussed upon started with rescue tube use. Then they are moved on to the 'Kirra nipper board' for board skills and junior Nipper boards



for some of the older participants.

As many of the participants want to get in the water straightaway, the skill teaching sessions are kept short with only several defined outcomes each week so the sessions balance between being informative and fun.

In keeping with the underlying lifesaving theme included in the weekly activities, the Starfish Nippers learnt and practised lifesaving hand signals. They also visited the patrol teams on the beach and in

the patrol tower to see what they did. The Starfish Nippers also experienced firsthand the IRB and ATV.

The season finished with a "Starfish Ironman" competition, they then enjoyed the end of season party with the Woodside Nippers and Volunteers.

The eight-week program ended with great camaraderie between all the Nippers and families and volunteers from the Club, as well as resounding positive attitude towards returning next year.

CRUSADERS CORNER

Well what a ride this year has been! After the birth of the Crusaders, now 9 years ago, our numbers involved in our Club based Youth Engagement Program (YEPs) continues to flourish. This season we extended our program to 25 year old members, encouraging a healthy contingent of previous Crusaders to make up the bulk of our Crusader Facilitators – they demonstrated leadership in beginning to develop their own program - which is absolutely AWESOME!

It was exciting to see the 19 to 25 year old cadets double their age group total

since last season. Our challenge now is to continue to work with the 17 year old cadets and older to keep reengaging them every season, and on attracting and keeping engaged new 13 to 18 year old cadets, to ensure the growth of the group.

Youth this season contributed significantly to the operations of the Club in assisting with water safety, patrols, abalone patrol, community events and Nippers, plus surf sports and Clubhouse maintenance and social.

We have had a huge amount of fun over the years, with this year being no exception. We started with our first outing at the Wake Park back in October; IRB/RWC famils; IRB Awards; held a number of exercises with Marine Rescue Rockingham; completed our SRC/BNZ/IRBC crew development program that finished with the SRC/Bronze Camp sleepover; conducted abalone patrols, rock rescue famils of Secret Harbour Beach with our U13s along with a manikin retrieval from 3-5m (these guys just ate it up!); we had the Crusaders Challenge

where we had a number of mums and dads join us for a IRB induction and some parallel runs; and for the older guys we conducted powercraft famils at Denmark, Lancelin, Pengos and Point Peron.

There was a change in venue for our annual camp from Busseton to Camp Serpentine. Camp Serpentine allowed us to do some very different things to our usual southwest base while still being water based. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 pressures, we didn't get to complete as many activities as we had hoped but we still did heaps - roll on next season!
Our Club total hours this season were 5,417 making the 2,871 hours contribution from those involved in the Crusader program about half of all patrol activities in the Club. Our average volunteer hours per person are really high for young people who have school, work and home commitments throughout the season, but still remain focused on attending Crusaders events and patrols

throughout the year. Our Crusaders program saw 17 bronze medallion, 24 surf rescue certificate and 19 IRB crew members qualified.

Over the course of the season the Crusaders have been working towards their SRCs, Bronze, IRB Crew, Trainers and our YEPs rewards of Bronze, Silver and Gold by engaging in patrols, development activities and in Surf Sports. Five Crusaders showed absolute commitment this season with patrol over 50 hrs. Well done team: Patrick Walsh, Jack Stirling, Jasmine Noorman, Angus Belton, Mitchell Shackles, Jasmine Tong, Rhys David and Meagan Tong.

Many of the Crusaders are Age Managers, Assistant Managers, Office Bearers of the Club, and new and evolving trainers. Many are mentors to the younger Nippers and to their peers. Some have competed at the highest-level competition, and some have been acknowledged as evolving leaders, for example our two

Junior Club Captains, Zoe Shackles and Meagan Tong.

I'm sure if you go to the surf sports results section of this annual report you will all agree that we have been extremely well represented this season by the team of competitors with outstanding results in pool rescue, at countries and states, and in surf boats. I'm keen to see more of us involved next season and competing in the Australian titles that are to be held at Scarboro and Trigg SLSC and on our beach. We also will be potentially taking the lead as Crusaders to reinvigorate some of the Clubs more traditional events – watch this space.

STATE POOL RESCUE CHAMPIONSHIPS

What a huge achievement at the 2021 Pool Rescue Championships. we managed 3rd place against some much larger and very competitive clubs.

The event was held at the HBF Arena Joondulap 26th - 27th June 2021. We had 21 athletes entered and won medals in 34 events – a total of 28 individual and 6 team medals. Unfortunately, the 3 relay events for each age group were cancelled due to the sudden COVID restrictions. I was very impressed with the great sportsmanship and effort by all. Including those that didn't get a medal but gave their best on the day in a very competitive field.

The reason the Pool Rescue Competition is an important discipline for Surf Life Saving is because it forms 50% of a country's points at the lifesaving world championships (LWC) the other 50% of points are from traditional ocean and beach events.

The events include, rescuing a manikin weighing 60kg from the bottom of the pool and swimming it to the end. Juniors retrieve a 3.5kg brick. The sport is also very technical and has many varied events.

At club level its fun and uses swimming skills in a very different, interesting and

technical way. It engages our active members and keeps them fit over winter ready for beach patrol during summer.

Training at the aqua jetty has the added bonus of eliminating the winter environmental issues surf sports normally faces. We train two times a week and most competitors also attend formal swimming training several times a week.

I'm looking forward to see what this seasons training and competitions!

Rescue, which is awesome for the Club. Our IRB racing team were unfortunately unable to fire on all 2 cylinders in their comps, but had great fun along the way.

The early summer season's preparation started with training throughout the winter months, working on endurance and flat-water technique at various

locations with most training sessions held at Town Beach and the Mandurah canals at Keith Holmes Reserve.

We also started a structured beach program with Keith Bowron, who is an experienced athletics coach. Keith was supported as a Club in holding four carnivals during the season: a senior carnival which saw us host over 500 competitors; then the first ever Nipper

Regional Championships with Port Bouvard and Mandurah surf Clubs in December; plus two amazing surf boat carnivals. Once again, the feedback from the wider surf sports community was very positive and complimentary to SHSLSC, they all love coming to our beach, competing here, and enjoying the Club afterwards.

We were pleased to welcome two new

accredited coaches to the team this season, Dave McCarron and Keith Bowron. We now have a total of 8 accredited surf sports coaches at Secret Harbour SLSC with Andrew Ellis and Caine Hayes working towards their accreditation. We would like to thank all of our qualified and unqualified coaches for the amazing work you have done this season. A big thanks to Andrew Ellis and Carolyn Wilson for their coaching and diligent work behind





the scenes, leading and keeping the teams organised and motivated; and for achieving great results with our youth surf sports team this season.

Beno and Ross Onions headed up the training program for the boaties. Our Boaties ended the season with 1 x open women's crew, 1 x U23 crew, and 2 x U19 crews. Thanks to your efforts, increased interest from more members means next season is looking like a big one for the boaties.

Boaties this season successfully achieved a few medals at the Country championships and because of the growth they experienced, they were able to put in a boat relay team at the States, something the Club has not

been able to do for many years. There is already discussion amongst the Surf Sports team to look at fielding one or two teams for the Lifesaver Relay at the States and Aussies, which will be huge! The boat section would again like to thank Rockingham Toyota for the support they have shown to the Club and to the crews.

Looking ahead to the 2022/23 season, WA will be hosting the "Aussies", the 2023 Australian Surf Life Saving Championships. We need to shake things up a bit. Some of the things we will implement include a SHSLSC surf sports manual; well-structured and peer-reviewed training programs for the seniors that are built around periodisation and specialisation; and

group training sessions to build on our surf sports community spirit, coach discussions, and more. We are looking forward to our Surf Sports Coaches Committee being very active this season organising carnival set-up and pack-up, Nipper coaching sessions on Sundays and engaging with Parents to help them learn firsthand the joys of volunteering.

We are looking forward to building on the strengths of our team and setting them up for personal and Club best results and great success. Go Team Secrets.

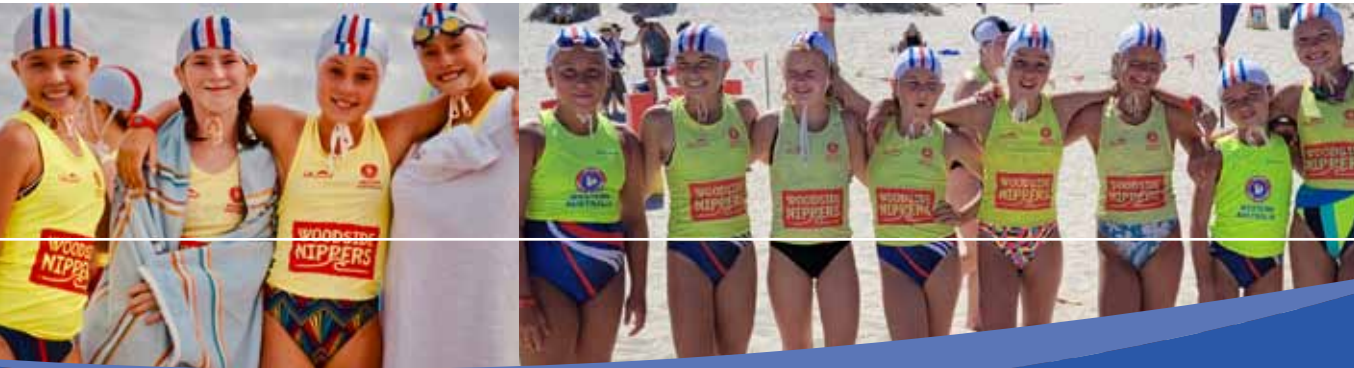
