CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT



As Club Captain, it's a privilege to reflect on and wrap up the 2025/26 season. A season that tells a story of people, of commitment, of community and of what it truly means to be part of Secret Harbour Surf Life Saving Club. This was reflected through our Weekly Wrap Ups, keeping members informed of the real impact we make as a Club.

Week in, week out, our members showed up. Early mornings, changing conditions, busy days on the beach — our patrol was there putting the safety of others first. Whether it was a preventative action, a first aid or simply being a visible presence on the sand, every action mattered. Once again, we upheld what we are so proud of — keeping our beach safe with no lives lost.

Across all portfolios there has been strong involvement throughout the season. From our youngest nippers learning the surf, to youth stepping into patrol pathways, through to members representing the Club at state and national level — including Aussies. There has been a real

sense of pride in wearing the red and yellow alongside our Club colours of blue, white and red. Two uniforms, one Club.

Like many clubs, we've felt the pressure of trying to do more with the same people and it's been a challenge at times. Many members are already contributing across multiple roles but to continue growing, we need more members to get involved. This is not about obligation — it's about ownership. This is our Club. One team. One family.

Beyond the beach, our impact and engagement within the community has been strong and meaningful, with



a highlight being our involvement with the Point Peron Aquatic Youth & Family Association. Board members and senior lifesavers delivered interactive demonstrations and aquatic safety education, while supporting one of our Youth Captains Iona in leadership tasks. We also proudly supported the City of Rockingham Youth Party, where many of our younger lifesavers took the lead — showing the strength of our youth, who really are the backbone of our Club.

The Rockingham Emergency Services Open Day provided another opportunity to connect with the community, with families engaging in beach safety activities, including the Qantas Beach Safety Quiz. From school visits to Bunnings and broader outreach, our members have continued to promote water safety and build strong community connections.

Our members have also contributed beyond our beach — supporting neighbouring clubs, assisting in regional operations, and contributing to state-based committees and Boards across Surf Life Saving. Well done everyone. One of the most powerful moments this season was standing shoulder to shoulder in memory of the Bondi incident — a reminder that we are part of a national family united in service and support.

I'd also like to recognise **Kyle McFarlane**, whose journey this season reflects what our Club is all about. After achieving his Bronze Medallion, Kyle continued to develop through First Aid, ART and the Rookie Lifeguard Program — and has already saved a life. His actions both on and off the beach show courage, leadership and care, and he is a true role model for our members.

When we reflect on our values — **Safety, Respect, Family, Unity, Integrity and Excellence** — we see them lived every day.

To every member, volunteer and family — thank you. This Club exists because of you. And as we look ahead to the 2026/27 season, I'm confident the best is still to come.

LIFESAVING REPORT



From a Lifesaving perspective, the 2025/26 season has been mixed. While our members have done amazing work this season, there is ongoing concern regarding member numbers and our ability to maintain our core purpose. We have seen our 129 volunteer lifesavers and water safety personnel donate 3,736 hours of their time to ensuring public safety. This is a great effort from everyone involved, the Club and the public you have all kept safe appreciate that you have given up your own time.



I discussed last season how our 17 patrolling member reduction had started to cause issues with keeping our patrols and water safety events running smoothly. This season we saw an additional 40 less people participating within the Lifesaving space, 12 less Crusaders age (13-17s) and 24 fewer Adults (26+). We have seen over our patrols large gaps in the roster and struggles to adequately man the Abalone patrols and Water Safety events.

The Board has been monitoring this, and acknowledges that patrolling membership retention and engagement must be our primary focus for the coming season.

The Secret Harbour Surf Lifesaving Club Board has started implementing and is working on more plans to help with keeping our members involved and engaged. These include holding the Lifesaving Forum to give everyone the opportunity to have their say in how we move forward with Lifesaving, and reducing the required patrols for Active Service from 6 to 5.

We are also working on creating more support for our patrols in the Duty Officer position, the creation of on patrol development session templates; and also plans to run development sessions open to all patrolling members over the off-season with regular monthly/bimonthly sessions during the season. The board will be holding workshops to give our members more chances to help us with our engagement project. I strongly encourage all members to give the Club a year to bring patrols up to speed.

This season we had our regular 48 Rostered Patrols, plus 5 Public Holidays. In addition, our members, along with Coogee SLSC, Fremantle SLSC, Marine Rescue Rockingham, the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions Rangers, completed 3 Abalone sessions; with the last two being poor conditions. Secret Harbour also hosted 2 State Carnivals, opened our beach to a third State Carnival ran by the Boat Panel and hosted our Club Championships. Our lifesavers supported an additional 4 water safety events, in total that is 62 different engagements over the 24-week season. Over those patrols and events we recorded over 50,000 beach attendees,

3,724 preventative actions, 73 first aids and 25 rescues. Thank you all for your work to keep those people safe or help their recovery.

In terms of Powercraft, Secret Harbour received a new SSV from SLSWA over the offseason which was well used by patrols. In addition, we received a new IRB hull and Engine from SLSWA to replace one of our ageing fleet. We were also fortunate enough to secure the Peach Grant to replace our beach IRB trailer with two new road worthy trailers; thanks to Adam for his hard work in that area. I would also like to thank Declan Tyrrell for his work in keeping our IRB engines running, without him our engines would be in a far worse condition.

In terms of RWC's we were fortunate to be part of two different trials, a Seadoo and a Supercharged Yamaha. It was good to have

From this Secret Harbour has been selected to be the host of a brand new Seadoo which will be replacing RWC 32 next season.

Finally I would like to thank the whole Lifesaving Committee for their work to keep the Patrols running smoothly. As mentioned above Declan and Adam worked hard on the powercraft, with Mark Thomas assisting with the Vehicles. As always, Carolyn Wilson worked her magic in the First Aid Room to ensure we always had all the gear we needed to patch up the public and ourselves, with the assistance of Stig Kalande. Aiden and Oliver Ayoub have also joined the team this season to assist with Drones, with their help Drones will be making a bigger appearance and impact next

season. A big thank you to our Club Captain Adam Hoes who has been a big support all over Lifesaving, his idea of the "Weekend Wrap-up" which evolved into covering all areas of the Club was a great initiative to keep us all informed about what was happening on our beach. Lastly, a thank you to all our Patrol Captains and Vice Captains for their leadership on the beach, without you our Patrols would not be able to operate. We are always looking for more people to step into our Lifesaving Leadership, if you are interested please send me an email, we have plenty of jobs that need to be done all year round.

I look forward to seeing you on the beach this coming October for it to start all over again.

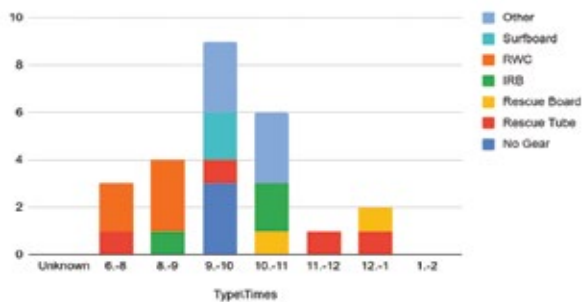

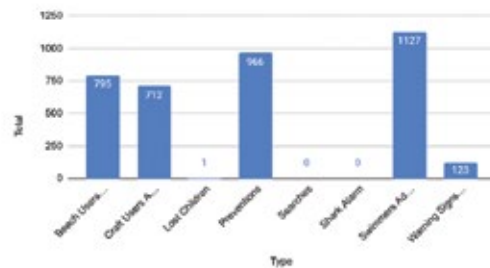

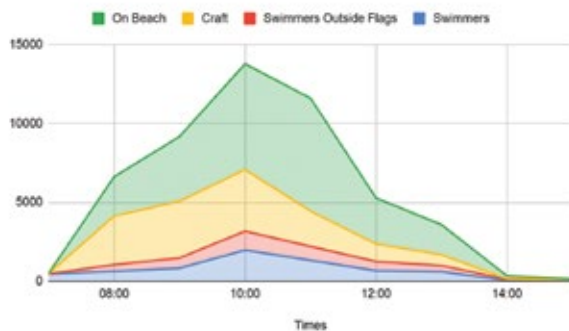

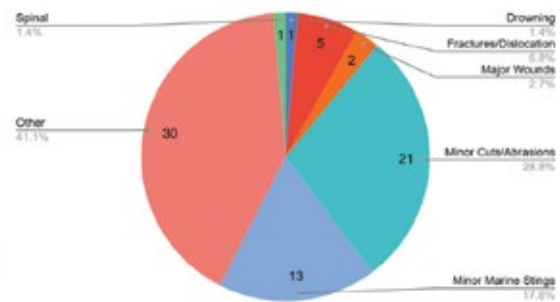
Preventative Actions (Total: 3724)

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2026

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Committee have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the Secret Harbour Surf Life Saving Club Inc. is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the financial reporting requirements of the members.

The financial report covers Secret Harbour Surf Life Saving Club Inc. as an individual entity. Secret Harbour Surf Life Saving Club Inc. is an association incorporated in Western Australia under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB'), as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities under the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012 and the Associations Incorporations Act 2015.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Association in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs. The accounting policies set out below have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

Accounting Policies

- (a) **Income Tax**
The Association has obtained tax-exempt status under current Australian Taxation legislation.
- (b) **Inventories**
Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined by the purchase price of the inventories.
- (c) **Property, Plant and Equipment**
Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses (if any).

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

(c) Property, Plant and Equipment (CONT'D)

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of motor vehicles and other assets is depreciated on a reducing balance basis.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
First aid room equipment	10% to 20%
Merchandise and Office equipment	10% to 100%
Rescue, Training and Comp equipment	10% to 100%
Social hall, bar and canteen	10% to 100%
Building	10% to 100%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed and adjusted, if appropriate, at each balance date.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are included in the income statement.

(d) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand and cash at banks.

(e) Revenue

Revenue from donations and Interest revenue are recognised upon receipt of the funds.

Grants received for recurrent expenditures and member's subscriptions are recorded as income in the year in which they are earned.

Revenue from sale of goods (trading income) is recognised when the control of goods is passed to members/customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(f) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

These statements should be read in conjunction with the attached compilation report of Ward & Ilsley Partners.

• **Post-Audit Amendments to Financial Records**

Over the past several years, we have noted instances where transactions were entered or amended within an audited financial year after the audit was completed. This year, a material adjustment was made to revenue received in advance. Post-audit changes can result in the accounting records no longer agreeing with the signed financial statements and may compromise the integrity of the audit trail.

We recommend that all balance sheet accounts be reviewed and reconciled at year end and that the financial year be locked in MYOB once the audit is complete and the balances have been finalised.

• **Receivables and Payables Reconciliation**

The receivables and payables reconciliations as at 30 April 2026 contained out-of-balance amounts within MYOB, indicating that the subsidiary ledgers did not agree with the relevant balance sheet accounts. We understand this resulted from a posting issue between the cloud and desktop versions of MYOB and has since been reviewed and rectified.

We recommend that the Club complete a comprehensive review of all reconciliations and underlying transactions before finalising and presenting the financial accounts for audit.

• **Treatment of PlayOn WA Grant**

The Club was notified on 29 July 2025 that it was expected to receive \$200,000 in government funding for facility upgrades. However, as at 30 April 2026, no formal grant agreement had been executed, the funding conditions had not been finalised and the funds had not been received. Accordingly, the journals previously recorded in relation to the grant were reversed and the proposed funding was disclosed as a contingent asset in the financial statements.

We recommend that the Club review the status of the grant before the next audit, including any further correspondence or executed funding agreements received, to ensure the grant is recognised in the appropriate reporting period in accordance with AASB 15 Revenue from Contracts with Customers and, where applicable, AASB 1058 Income of Not-for-Profit Entities.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Brad and Karen for their co-operation and assistance during the conduct of the audit.

MANAGEMENT LETTER – YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2026

We have completed our audit of the Secret Harbour Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. for the above year.

As stated in our engagement letter, our audit is designed to form an opinion on the financial report.

During the conduct of our audit we noted the following matters that we consider worthy of the committees attention:

• **Reconciliation and Finalisation of MYOB Prior to Audit**

We wish to remind the Club that, before the financial statements and MYOB file are provided for audit, the accounting records should be fully reconciled and updated for all adjusting journals processed by the Club's accountants during the year.

To enable the audit to be conducted efficiently, the MYOB ledger and financial statements provided should be complete, finalised and in agreement. Where these reconciliations and adjustments have not been completed before the audit commences, additional audit work may be required and the completion of the audit may be delayed.

We recommend that the Club implement a year-end review process to ensure all accountant adjustments have been posted and the MYOB balances have been reconciled to the final financial statements before the records are submitted for audit.

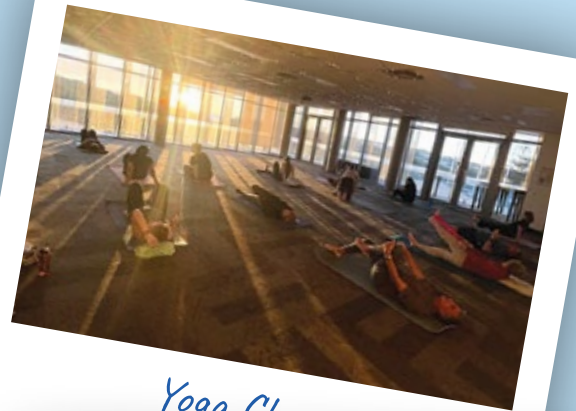

EDUCATION & TRAINING REPORT



As usual we have had a busy season in Education. Secret Harbour has run or worked with other clubs in 19 courses since 1st July, training 96 new awards for 72 people. I would like to congratulate all the candidates who successfully completed their training. Gaining these awards requires significant time, effort, and practice and goes towards keeping our members and the public safe.

Thank you to all our trainers, assessors and facilitators for your hard work this season. Without you, nothing would be able to run within our Club.

It was noted this season there was some misconceptions on how SLSWA training works. In order to become a trainee trainer you first complete the SLSWA Training Officer Course which provides the basics on how to deliver courses. From there you select a course and work under a full trainer to help deliver 80% of two courses. This gives you the knowledge required to train that award which then enables you to deliver that specific award. This step is repeated for any course you wish to train. This season Adam Hoes, Derry Smith and Sarah Young each completed their training to deliver specific courses.

Within Education there is no rest over the off season. We are already looking at what is going to happen over the off season and into next season. Planning is underway for a number of development sessions that will be run starting this off season.

These will include:

- Search and Rescue training utilising the new SAR kit received from SLSWA this season
- First Aid Training both internally and working to complete exercises with Saint John Ambulance
- General Patrol Skills, including radios and signals
- Powercraft skills, including rescues, handling, and SAR

As everyone would know I have been acting in the Director of Education role as well as my substantive Director of Lifesaving role. These are pretty much the two most busy portfolios over the main season and it was hard keeping on top of both areas. I appreciate the help of all the trainers in managing themselves, and especially the help of Adam Hoes, Garry Williams and Carolyn Wilson who oversaw the different areas.

In March the Board announced that we had found a new Director of Education and I would like to welcome Ashleigh Reid. Ash has an extensive emergency operations training background; her family had previously been members and Ash has rejoined the Club this season to come into the role. I look forward to working closely with her to help build up Lifesaving into the coming season.
